


T'Challa was 10 years old when he was adopted in 2020 to a Marine Corps veteran. Now 11, he developed pain in his joints that compromised his quality of life.

Franky lost his ear flaps when he was used as a bait dog and left for dead. In 2019 a highly decorated combat veteran was inspired to save him.


For the rest of his life Franky will require ongoing ear care, which he receives thanks to our supporters' compassion and generosity.

26 veterans received hardship support to care for their four-legged family






Our hardship fund provided vital support during Julie's recovery. Luna taught her that "anything can heal with a bit of love."

Recently, the Army veteran experienced some tough medical challenges. Support through our hardship fund is helping to ease his burden.


